Disaster in Hiroshima and Nagasaki...




The atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki were nuclear attacks near the end of World War II against the Empire of Japan by the United States at the executive order of U.S. President Harry S. Truman on August 6 and August 9, 1945, respectively. The nuclear weapon "Little Boy" was dropped on the city of Hiroshima on Monday, August 6, 1945, followed on August 9 by the detonation of the "Fat Man" nuclear bomb over Nagasaki. These are to date the only attacks with nuclear weapons in the history of warfare.





In Hiroshima the atomic cloud (mushroom cloud) produced just after the burst is one of the most intensive characteristics of the A-bomb explosion. Clouds were observed. Altitude of 12,000 meters or more

In the early morning hours of August 6, 1945, a B-29 bomber named Enola Gay took off from the island of Tinian and headed north by northwest toward Japan. The bomber's primary target was the city of Hiroshima. Hiroshima had a civilian population of almost 300,000 and was an important military centre, containing about 43,000 soldiers. Hiroshima was described as "an important army depot and port of embarkation in the middle of an urban industrial area.




was the last major act of world war two and within days the Japanese had surrendered. The city of Nagasaki had been one of the largest sea ports in southern Japan and was of great wartime importance because of its wide-ranging industrial activity, including the production of ordnance, ships, military equipment, and other war materials.

The bombing of Nagasaki on august 9th

The Fat Man mushroom cloud resulting from the nuclear explosion over Nagasaki rises 18 km (11 mi, 60,000 ft) into the air from the hypocenter.


Hiroshima before the bombing


Hiroshima After the bombing



Fierce heat rays and radiation burst out in every direction, unleashing a high pressure shockwave, vaporising tens of thousands of people and animals, melting buildings and streetcars, reducing a 400-year-old city to dust.


There were many buildings of Ferro-concrete structure in Hiroshima, mostly in the vicinity of the hypocenter. According to a survey, these durable buildings were only destroyed if they were within 500 meters of the hypocenter. Buildings of earthquake-proof construction were damaged only on the inside. However, many buildings situated beyond 500 meters were essentially destroyed too, as in the case of this clock store situated farther than 500 meters.

Thermal Rays Leave Human Shadow On Stone Steps ...



The left photograph shows the stone steps of the main entrance of Sumitomo Bank which is only 250 meters from the hypocenter. It is believed that a person sat down on the steps facing the direction of the hypocenter, possibly waiting for the bank to open. By a flash of the heat rays with temperatures well over a 1,000 degrees or possibly 2,000 degrees centigrade, that person was incinerated on the stone steps.

Thermal Rays Leave Shadow Of Handrail..



The right photograph shows the shadow made by the heat rays. This place is about 800 meters from the hypocenter, and the unshielded asphalt surface was scorched, whereas the surface shielded by the handrail appears to be a whitish shadow.

Houses of citizens...



Beneath the centre of the explosion, temperatures were hot enough to melt concrete and steel. Within seconds, 75,000 people had been killed or fatally injured with 65% of the casualties nine years of age and younger.

300-Year-Old Camphor Tree Uprooted By The Blast..



By a blast pressure of 19 tons per square meter, the tree was uprooted. Also, hundreds of tombstones were knocked in all directions by the complex flow of wind from the blast.

The Atomic Bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki killed about 250,000 people and became the most dreadful slaughter of civilians in modern history. However, for many years there was a curious gap in the photographic records....








The left photograph shows a 21-years-old soldier who was in a wooden house situated I kilometre from the hypocenter. Since he was indoors, he was saved from burns, but, as he received cuts on his buck, right elbow and right belly, first-aid treatment was given to him and purplish subcutaneous haemorrhage starts to appear. September 3 he Died at 9:30 p.m.

And the right photograph shows an eyeball of an A-bomb victim who got an atomic bomb cataract. There is opacity near the centre of the eyeball.

The bombs killed as many as 140,000 people in Hiroshima and 80,000 in Nagasaki by the end of 1945, with roughly half of those deaths occurring on the days of the bombings. Amongst these, 15-20% died from injuries or the combined effects of flash burns, trauma, and radiation burns, compounded by illness, malnutrition and radiation sickness. Since then, more have died from leukaemia (23 l observed) and solid cancers (334 observed) attributed to exposure to radiation released by the bombs. In both cities, most of the dead were civilians.....

- 5. Best washing machines in the world.... and so on.


Japan achieved these goals in different ways. e.g.




Toyoda automatic loom (Type G)
